The Texas General Land Office (GLO) Community Development and Revitalization program has completed its review of all materials submitted to date in support of Harris County's (the County) Method of Distribution (MOD) Amendment No. 1 for the Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds. We are happy to inform you that the County's MOD Amendment No. 1 has been approved.

The amendment moves \$13,159,931 non-housing/infrastructure funds to housing for the City of Houston. The housing allocation for the City is \$23,486,698. The total CDBG-DR allocation for the City of Houston remains unchanged at \$23,486,698.

The County posted the MOD amendment on the Harris County Community Service Department website for public comment from September 19, 2018 to October 3, 2018. No comments were received.
