



ARE YOU PET PREPARED?

Food and Water

Keep 3-7 days worth of food in an airtight, waterproof container, and have a water bowl to use.

First-Aid Kit

Include items appropriate for your pet's medical needs, and additional supplements they take daily.

Collar with ID Tags

Have printed copies of your pet's registration information on hand and available electronically.

Familiar Items

Include familiar items such as beds, toys, treats, and bones to relieve your pet's stress.

Pet Kennel

Familiarize your pet with the carrier so they are comfortable, and practice your evacuation plan with the kennel.

Photos of Your Pet

Include photos of your pet in case they get separated during an emergency.

Microchipping

Microchipping ensures your pet can be found if they get lost during a disaster.

Develop a Buddy System

In case you cannot take care of your pet while evacuating, ensure friends or neighbors are available to care for them.

Bring Pets Indoors

Always bring pets indoors before severe weather or a disaster.
